### A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

A funny thing happens when you sign on to direct a Shakespeare play. No matter the circumstance, there's always one question that everyone asks: "How is this production going to be different?"

A Midsummer Night's Dream is my favorite Shakespeare play. Like for so many, it was my first, and it's one that I have continued to return to at various points in my life. Part of why I love it so much is because every time I experience it, something new resonates depending on where I am in my personal journey.

As I revisited this play as an adult, I was struck by the relationships. This is a story about love. Everyone is just trying to be seen; however, something keeps getting in the way. Pride. Fear of commitment. Feeling silenced. Whatever it is, no one is quite getting what they want, and no one knows how to ask for it. Shakespeare leave us with the questions: What are we willing to do to be seen, and what stands in the way? How far will we go for love, and at what cost?

And so, we run away to the forest. "Puck's Playground" as we have been calling it. A world in which anything is possible. Where there is a fine line between dream and nightmare, and the in-between is just chaos. All of these characters are put to the test as they come toe to toe with their deepest desires – it's just a matter of what they do with it on the other side. Shakespeare leaves us with yet another question: *If all limitations were lifted, what would you say?* 

And so, I invite you into our dreamscape. Maybe you too will remember a journey with a loved one that took a turn. Perhaps you will reflect on your deepest desires, or even have a little fun in the chaos. Maybe, like our characters, you will learn a little something along the way about how you wish to be seen, and how to find the courage to advocate for that.

But to return to the question, "How is this production going to be different?" I think the best I can do is throw a question back at you. For a story that can have such personal resonance to anyone who experiences it, maybe you should tell me?




